

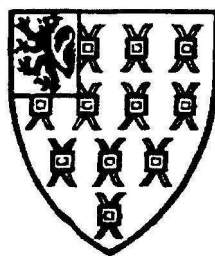

THE OLD HALL, LINCOLN'S INN

PROGRAMME

The old Hall of Lincoln's Inn is one of London's great historic buildings. Erected in 1490, its oak beams looked down on members of the inn eating, drinking and debating while Christopher Columbus was sailing towards the New World. The Hall is larger than when Sir Thomas More joined the Inn in 1496, for in 1624 a southern bay was added, with a wooden screen designed by Inigo Jones. Restoration and refurbishment work was carried out in the 1920s and in 1991, but the Hall is unaltered in substance. For a century and a half the Hall was used as the High Court of Chancery, and Dickens set the opening scene of Bleak House there. The arms of distinguished members of the Inn displayed include those of Sir Thomas More and of eight of the fifteen members of the Inn who have become Prime Ministers.

Access to Lincoln's Inn by car is through the main gate in the South East corner of Lincoln's Inn Fields. Free parking will be available to those attending the Dinner.
