CANTATA ALFRED: Thomas Arne (1710-1772) was thirty when he composed music for James Thomson's "Masque of Alfred" for a garden party at Cliveden for the Prince of Wales. It received its first performance on 1st August 1740 in a small amphitheatre not far from the Ilex Grove and the Blenheim Pavilion, and is famous for its "Rule Britannia" said by Wagner to summarise the whole British character in the opening strain.
